# **HOST HOME FAQ**

#### WHAT IS A HOST HOME?

Oneighty Weekend doesn't happen without families who are willing to open their homes to our students and leaders. It is a unique opportunity to serve, and we are incredibly thankful for our host home families!

#### \*\*HOST HOME RESPONSIBILITIES

- A <u>room</u> for the Group Leader(s) We ask that you provide a room for the group leader(s) to sleep in that is separate from where the students sleep.
- <u>Sleeping space</u> for Students. Provide sleeping space for the students. This can be a living room or game room type area. The students will be bringing their own sleeping bags, blankets, air mattresses, and pillows. They will also provide their own towels and toiletries.
- Meeting space for Students. This space can be the space they also sleep in.
- <u>Transportation Assistance</u>. Assist in transporting students to and from the church and home. You do not have to stay for the worship services; however, you are welcome to! Make sure you let us know how many available seats you have in your vehicle.
- Complete Background Check & Safety Training. The safety of our students is a top priority. As the event approaches, we will be sending you a link to complete a background check and child safety training if you do not currently have a background check on file with FBC. Everyone that is 18 years old and older that is staying in your home during Oneighty Weekend will need to complete this process.
- This year you will be responsible for providing Saturday morning breakfast and Saturday night dinner. For any expenses you incur for these meals, our student ministry will provide reimbursement. We have budgeted between \$150-\$250 per house total depending on the size of your specific group.

#### If I have specific house rules, can they apply during Oneighty Weekend?

Yes! If you have house rules like "don't slide down the stairs on your air mattress" feel free to let the students know! If you prefer that shoes be left by the front door and not worn all over the house, just let the group know when you all arrive at the house. While the group will invade your home, we don't want to neglect your preferences or disrespect your home. You can always post house rules on the fridge or in the common meeting area as a reminder.

#### Can I sit in on the small group sessions?

No. The Bible study leaders have been equipped to lead this small group time so we ask that you do not sit in on the group times. If you are hosting your child's small group, we ask that neither parent sit in on the group time. We want all students to be comfortable sharing and maintain a healthy level of confidentiality.

Our goal is to create a safe and comfortable environment for our students to be able to <u>open up</u> in. Just as in our regular small groups we strive to create a "relational environment" and want that to happen during Oneighty Weekend as well.

#### What if we have small children in our home?

Having small children in the home is not a problem at all! We welcome the family environment that it creates. The only thing we do ask is that they <u>not</u> be in the room during small group discussion times. Due to the nature of things that may be brought up in the discussion, we don't want little ears to hear something that they are not ready to hear, precious little ones can be a distraction from fully participating in the discussion.

#### What if I cannot help with transportation at any point during Oneighty Weekend?

Let us know immediately so that we can find supplemental drivers for those times if needed.

#### Do we need to handle any disciplinary issues?

If the issue is something like students still being awake and giggling loudly at 3AM, you absolutely have the authority to ask them to quiet down. If a student is caught breaking any of the rules we have set for the event, the small group leader can take care of it. **NEVER yell at our students.** Staff members can always be contacted if anyone is unsure of how to handle a situation.

#### **FAQs Continued**

#### If there are multiple leaders in the group who leads the discussions?

If there is more than one leader in your group, take time to discuss who is responsible for facilitating each small group time. You can each be responsible for different group times or you can tag team each session. It's up to you.

#### What if a student mentions something that may need to be reported to the authorities?

If a student mentions something at any point during the event that may require the authorities to be notified, please immediately contact a staff member and we will walk you through the next steps to take. Because we are working with minors confidentiality only stems so far... students need to be aware that confidentiality is very important to us however, if they tell us that they are doing something to harm themselves, doing something that harms someone else, or being harmed by another person, we are legally obligated to tell someone. It is extremely important that you do not promise the student that you will not tell anyone the secret they want to tell you. We always hope for open lines of communication and we do not want to compromise the trust of a student by making a promise that we can not keep.

#### Do we need to handle any disciplinary issues?

Yes. You have the authority to speak in to a situation where there is disruptive or destructive behavior. If a student breaks the rules you can address it with the student. Please notify a staff member of any situation so that we can be aware and take follow up steps if necessary. If a student persists in disruptive behavior or refuses to listen to you, please contact a staff member.

#### Are students allowed to leave and come back during the event?

A student is only allowed to leave and return if they have filled out the time-away forms. During the event, if you find it has not been filled out we will still need parental consent in writing. They can do this by going to the website and submitting a time-away request right then. Once it's been filled out the student can leave. <a href="mailto:once">oneightystudents.com/weekend</a>

\*\*Time Away forms for your specific house WILL come to you. We need Host Homes to help coordinate this specific item within your group.

# **PARENT FAQ**

#### What is the student/leader ratio?

We will not know the exact ratio until after registration closes, but our goal is to have one leader for every eight students.

#### Will my student need money?

Your registration fee covers everything including rallies, sessions, t-shirt, all meals, and recreation. The only items not covered in your registration fee are snacks you may want to bring to your host home and any merchandise you may want to purchase from the band or speaker (CDs, books, shirts, etc.).

#### Who will be out with the Middle School students at Chaparral?

Similar to their camp experience, we will have both full-time staff members and college small group leaders out at Chaparral with your students. Students will have adult supervision at all times. We will also be enlisting the help of a few adult volunteers to help out on-site.

#### Who are the Host Homes?

Host homes are people within our church that love Jesus and love students. All are known individuals that we trust. All Host Homes fill out background checks and applications.

#### Who will my student be spending time with?

While this is a big event, students are broken down into small groups with 1-2 college leaders. Students may request one person they would like to room with. Homes and dorms are separated by gender and also grade as much as possible. We do our best to make sure every student is with at least one friend.

#### What if I have a game/practice that weekend...can I still come?

Yes! Parents will need to fill out a **Time Away card**. You will simply slip out when you need to go and return when you are done. We want you to be at whatever part of the weekend you can! Time Away forms are filled out exclusively on our website and once completed will notify our staff and the leaders for your child's group.

#### What's going on Wednesday night?

ONEIGHTY Weekend kicks off on Wednesday night to give us an early start to the weekend. Students will receive tons of information at the Rally for the weekend.

#### Where do I drop my student off on Friday night?

You will need to bring it to the church Friday night. We will have volunteers help transport luggage after services to the homes. Middle School check-in is in Cross Tower Entrance and High School Check-in is at Courtyard Atrium

# **IMPORTANT DETAILS**

- Students are permitted to come and go with the appropriate "time away form," filled out by a parent. <u>Time away forms</u> are located online (https://www.oneightystudents.com) and will be available ONLINE only, Thursday Feb 22 once student host homes have been announced.
- Students who are driving will drive to their host home on Friday night after the services but will not drive again until leaving for church on Sunday morning. The <u>exceptions</u> are those who have turned in a "<u>time away form</u>."
- \*Also, the <u>12<sup>th</sup> grade</u> (Seniors who are 18 years old) students will be allowed to drive to and from events but not allowed to transport other students, including other 18-year old's.
- "Pranking" of homes by other homes during Oneighty Weekend will not be allowed under any conditions. No exceptions. A student(s) can be sent home immediately for pranking.
- Students will be responsible for all electronics (Airpods, Phones, iPads, etc.). We will help search for lost items, but the church will not assume responsibility for lost electronic items.
- A great time will be had by all, but in order to limit distractions, <u>cell phones</u> will not be allowed during small groups or worship sessions.

### STUDENT RULES

- Stay with your group & group leader at all times during Oneighty Weekend.
- Under no circumstances should students or leaders be anywhere other than where they are scheduled to be (church, host homes, activity locations). It is crucial for the staff to know where groups are at all times.
- Students are permitted to come and go with the appropriate "time away form," filled out by a parent. <u>Time away forms</u> are located online (https://www.oneightystudents.com) and will be available Thursday Feb 13th once student host homes have been announced.
- Take care of your host homes. Abide by all house rules that they provide for you. Be sure to thank them for opening their home to you by taking good care of it!
- No pranks. Pranks might be fun but they can be a huge distraction. No water guns, toilet paper, shaving cream, or other prank materials. "Pranking" of homes by other homes at Oneighty will not be tolerated under any conditions. No exceptions. A student(s) can be sent home immediately for pranking.
- Respect all leaders, pastors, and host homes. For your safety do what they ask you to do the first time.
- Students who are driving will drive to their host home on Friday night after the services but will not
  drive again until leaving for church on Sunday morning. The <u>exceptions</u> are those who have
  turned in a "time away form."
- \*Also the <u>12th grade</u> (Seniors who are 18 years old) students <u>will be allowed</u> to drive to and from events, but not allowed to transport other students.
