BELIEVE

EXPLORE GOD'S WORD

3–5 minutes

Today we continue a short series on the power of our testimony. EVERYONE who has had an encounter with Jesus has a testimony. A testimony is simply a story of what Jesus has done in your life. A testimony has 3 parts: (1) Who I was before Christ (2) How I encountered Jesus and why I chose to follow him (3) What Jesus is doing in my life now.
